# WIN TIME! Credit or No Credit

## Greetings Families,

This year your child will be taking a class called WIN Time for credit. Please refer to the following questions and answers. If you need additional information, please contact their WIN teacher.

## What will my child learn in this class?

WIN is an acronym for What I Need. WIN Classes provide enrichment opportunities for students based on their academic and/or social-emotional needs. For information regarding your child's specific WIN class, please contact their WIN teacher.

### How will my child be graded?

Each assignment is graded using the following categories

++	Exceeds Expectations
+	Met Expectations
~	Approached Expectations
_	Did NOT Meet Expectations
Ab	Absent/Excused

Students are required to meet (+) or exceed (++) expectations on 80% (or more) of their work.

Students will be assessed on work completion and quality.

### What if my child is absent?

Students are excused from individual assignments that are given when they are reported absent from school; with the exception of larger projects that students had multiple class days to complete.

#### How will I know my child's grade throughout the school year?

Parents and students can check their progress on MiStar. Since credit is calculated at the end of the marking period an overall grade will not be present in MiStar, however, you will be able to see their grade on each assignment. At the end of the marking period, the teacher will calculate the percentage of assignments that your child met (+) or exceeded (++) expectations on. Students who met (+) or exceeded (++) expectations on 80% (or more) of their work will earn Credit. Their report card will show CR for their grade.

## What if my child does not earn credit?

If your child does not earn credit their report card will state they have received No Credit for the class with the code NC. Your child's teacher will contact you with more information regarding your child's grade and what actions will take place during the following marking period for your child.
