
What is an Early Middle College?

An early middle college (EMC) is a Michigan Department of Education (MDE) approved five-year program of study. The EMC is designed to allow a pupil to earn a high school diploma and one or more of the following:

- ✓ 60 transferable college credits
- ✓ An associate degree
- ✓ A professional certification
- ✓ The Michigan Early Middle College Association (MEMCA) technical certificate
- Participation in a registered apprenticeship

Benefits of Early Middle College

- Nationally, EMC students graduate from high school at a rate of 93%, compared to the national graduation rate of 78% for all students¹.
- Nationally, EMC students earn an average of 23 college credits upon graduating from high school, and 88% enroll in college in the immediate fall².
- ✓ EMCs provide a low-cost option for college tuition. The tuition is generally paid for by the local school district.
- ✓ EMC students earn significant college credits.
