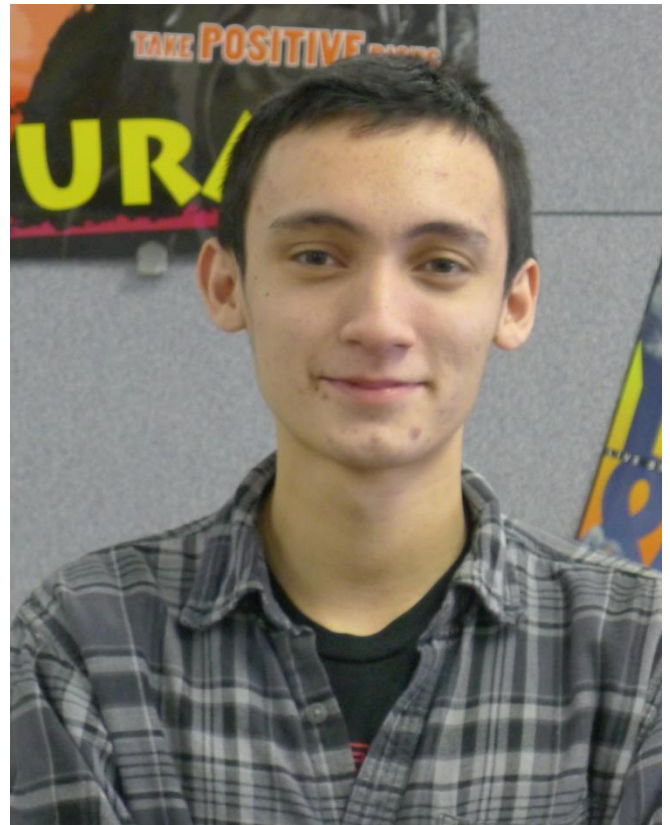


Robert Southall

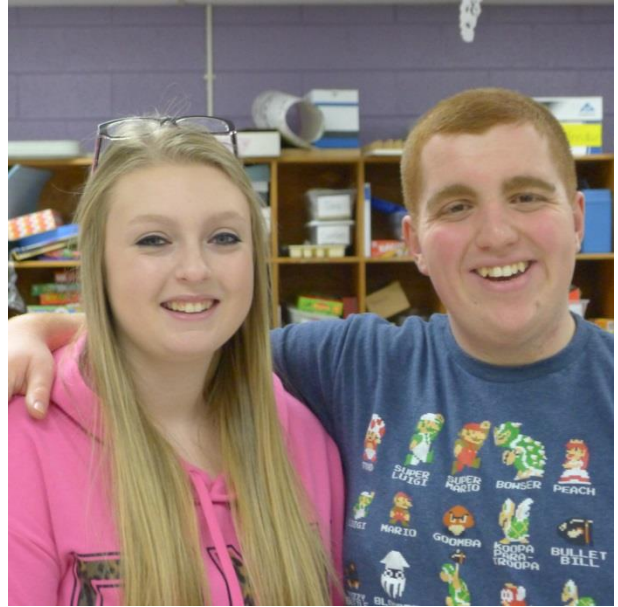
