First Student Council 1923

The first Student Council was organized in 1923. It was created by students to provide ways and means of taking care of various school activities that could be looked after by the students. Students felt that it was an opportunity for developing and using qualities of leadership while at the same time assisting in the work of their school. The first Student Council was a huge success. It saw school spirit, which was decidedly low that year, increase by at least 50 percent; a school paper was arranged for and is now edited and published every two weeks by the students; school parties were provided for; all visiting teams were entertained; for the first time a school declaimer was sent to compete in the Upper Peninsula contest, and a lost and found committee was formed. The Student Council appointed committees to take charge of bulletin boards, the arranged for auditorium meetings assisted in equipping teams, assisted in proper care of the building, and provided a play room for the rural students who were forced to remain in the building during the noon hour.
